Crime Analysis Report 3rd Quarter 2011

There has been an **8.6% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for the third quarter of 2011, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for the third quarter of 2010:

Part I Crime decreased by 3.2%	(from 472 to 457)
Part II Crime decreased by 11.1%	(from 1,022 to 909)
Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals) decreased by 8.6%	

Homicide:	No change	(from 1 to 1)
Rape:	40.0% decrease	(from 5 to 3)
Robbery:	26.7% decrease	(from 15 to 11)
Aggravated Assault:	9.1% decrease	(from 22 to 20)
Burglary:	8.2% increase	(from 49 to 53)
Larceny:	4.7% decrease	(from 360 to 343)
Auto Theft:	30.0% increase	(from 20 to 26)

An analysis of Part I Offense data shows that there was an increase this quarter (as compared to the same quarter in 2010) in burglaries and auto thefts. There was a decrease in rapes, robberies, aggravated assaults and larcenies.

An analysis of the data between the second quarter of 2011 and the third quarter of 2011 shows an overall **decrease in crime of 2.4%**. Part I Offenses increased by 0.4% (from 455 to 457) with the following categories showing increases - 200.0% increase in rapes (from 1 to 3), 25.0% increase in aggravated assaults (from 16 to 20), 8.2% increase in burglaries (from 49 to 53) and 13.0% increase in auto thefts (from 23 to 26). Part II Offenses decreased by 3.7% (from 944 to 909).

Part II Crimes are defined as minor assaults, arson, forgery-counterfeiting, bad checks, embezzlement, stolen property, vandalism, weapons offenses, prostitution, sex offenses, controlled dangerous substance (CDS) violations, gambling, family offenses, juvenile offenses, liquor law violations, disorderly conduct, suicide, and non-traffic offenses.

Cumulative Year to Date

There has been an **8.2% decrease** in crime within the City of Gaithersburg for January-September of 2011, as compared to the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) statistics for January-September of 2010:

Part I Crime	decreased by 9.1%	(from 1,434 to 1,303)
Part II Crime	decreased by 7.7%	(from 2,849 to 2,630)
Overall, Total Crime (Part I and Part II totals)	decreased by 8.2%

Rape:	20.0% decrease	(from 10 to 8)
Robbery:	26.1% decrease	(from 46 to 34)
Aggravated Assault:	14.5% decrease	(from 55 to 47)
Burglary:	3.4% decrease	(from 145 to 140)
Larceny:	9.9% decrease	(from 1,116 to 1,006)
Auto Theft:	8.2% increase	(from 61 to 66)
